### Course Content

Math Lab 8 is an intervention course designed to review and refine Pre-Algebra skills and introduce students to Algebraic thinking. Successful completion will result in placement in Algebra 1. The General Mathematics Content Standards (see attached) will be used as a guide.

### Textbook

Students receive a McDougal Littell, Algebra Readiness textbook to use and keep at home in order to alleviate carrying the textbook to and from school. The textbook must be covered at all times. Damage to the book will result in a fine at the end of the school year.

### Daily Materials

Students are expected to have the following supplies daily:

- One-inch binder for MATH ONLY
- Five dividers (Notes, Homework, Quizzes/Tests, DMR, Binder/Graph Paper)
- Binder Paper
- Perforated quad-spiral notebook
- Pencils/mechanical pencils with eraser
- Colored ballpoint pens
- Pencil pouch
- Miniature stapler with an ample amount of staples
- An inexpensive scientific calculator
- Two dry-erase markers
- Pine Valley Binder Reminder

### Classroom Guidelines

In order to create and maintain an environment conducive to learning, students are expected to adhere to the following guidelines:

- Be in your seat before the bell rings.
- Be considerate of others. (Respect students' and teachers' comments, opinions, and ideas.)
- Bring all materials needed for class.
- Keep hands, feet, and other objects to yourself.
- Obey all school rules outlined in the Pine Valley Handbook.

The following consequences will be enforced for choosing not to adhere to the guidelines:

- Verbal warning
- Litter Pick-Up
- If the student is unable to correct the behavior, a fifteen-minute detention is assigned and a parent/guardian is notified.
- Administrative referral

### Tardy Policy

Being tardy to class disrupts the learning environment. Students are expected to be in their assigned seat before the bells rings. Unexcused tardies will be dealt with as follows:

- 1<sup>st</sup> Tardy – Verbal Warning
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Tardy – Litter Pick-Up
- 3<sup>rd</sup> Tardy – Fifteen-minute detention, parent/guardian notified through Schoolloop
- 4<sup>th</sup> Tardy – Administrative Referral

### Grading

A quarter grade is composed of daily homework/classwork assignments (5 points – see Homework Hints attached), quizzes (10-50 points), and tests (100 points). A semester grade is determined by averaging two quarters. A letter grade is assigned to the student's percent of points earned in relation to the points possible.

100 – 93 = A	76.9 – 73 = C

86.9 – 83 = B	66.9 – 63 = D

Students and parents are encouraged to visit Schoolloop ([www.pvms.schoolloop.com](http://www.pvms.schoolloop.com)) daily to monitor student progress. Grades are published at least once a week. Schoolloop's calendar is a reliable resource to find daily homework assignments and quiz/test announcements. To register for Schoolloop, a student identification number is required. Follow these steps to register:

- Go to [www.pvms.schoolloop.com](http://www.pvms.schoolloop.com)
- Select **Register Now**
- Select **Parent Registration**
- Enter necessary information
- Click the blue **Register** button on the bottom left of the page
- Read the User Agreement

If you choose to accept the agreement, click the blue **Accept Agreement** button.

Late homework is not accepted. At the teacher's discretion, a student may attend Academic Saturday School once per quarter to complete three missing homework assignments for half-credit. Students receive one "Homework Helper" per quarter. A "Homework Helper" extends the due date by one school day. If a "Homework Helper" is attached to a completed homework assignment and submitted in a timely manner, the assignment will be accepted for full credit. The use of a "Homework Helper" is recorded as a footnote on Schoolloop's progress report.

### Absences

If a student is absent, it is the student's responsibility to acquire notes and assignments missed during the absence. Students are encouraged to visit Schoolloop to find missed assignments. Absent work must be completed and submitted within a reasonable amount of time upon returning to the classroom.

### Recommendations

In order to receive a recommendation for Algebra 1, the following district criteria must be met:

- An overall grade of 80% or better first and second semester  
75% of the overall grade is based upon assessment, 25% of the overall grade is based upon homework/classwork
- Proficient percentage to be determined on a district Algebra Readiness Exam
- 75% or better on the Algebra Readiness Test
- Teacher recommendation

If the criteria are not met, the student will be recommended for High School Math at California High School (see California High School Mathematics Program).

### **Office Hours**

If a student is performing below apparent ability or struggling with assignments, students are encouraged to visit the appropriate teacher during scheduled “office hours.” It is the student’s responsibility to ask for help BEFORE an assignment is due.

Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays – 2:30-3:15 p.m.

Office hours may change throughout the year due to coaching and/or afternoon conferences. Changes will be announced on Schoolloop.
